## Earning A Buck (classroom activity A)

Activity	Time	Objective	Description
Introduction	3 minutes		Explain that people are given money (income) for tasks that they accomplish (earned income) and as gifts (gifted income).
Discussion	7 minutes	To identify the difference between earned and gifted income and identify tasks they can complete to earn money.	<ul> <li>Discuss with the students the difference between earned and gifted income.</li> <li>Write "Earned" and "Gifted" in two columns on the board.</li> <li>Have the students give examples of ways to earn money and examples of gifted income and put them into the appropriate column on the board.</li> </ul>
Classroom Activity	8 minutes	To reinforce the concepts taught in this lesson through hands-on activities.	<ul> <li>Hand out the Earn A Buck activity sheets.</li> <li>Have the students work on the sheets individually or in a group.</li> <li>Walk through the instructions of the first part of the activity (number one), and then walk through one example as a class and let the students begin working.</li> <li>Walk through the instructions of the second part of the activity (number two), and then walk through one example as a class and let the students begin working.</li> </ul>
Conclusion	2 minutes		<ul> <li>Ask the students a few questions to review the lesson.</li> <li>Explain the importance of knowing the difference between earned and gifted income as well as how important it is to work hard to earn money.</li> </ul>
